Procedure:

1. Start by asking children to name 3 living things. Living things include organisms such as animals and plants. Ask them to name 3 things that are non-living. Non-living things include substances such as dirt, water, air, and minerals.
2. Take children outside to an area where there are living and non-living things.
3. Have children look in the area and try to find things for all categories on the bingo card and have them draw a picture of it. The categories are: Green living, Brown non-living, Soft living, Hard non-living, Brown living, Blue non-living, Sticky living, Invisible non-living and Yellow living.
4. Children who finish early may want to help the younger ones find the hard to locate items.

How do you grow respect, responsibility, and resourcefulness? The Farm Service Agency's (FSA) Rural Youth Loan program provides financial assistance and business planning to help rural youth get a start on their futures, while ensuring the future of the family farms.

Who Can Apply?

To qualify for a loan you must be a citizen of the United States or a permanent resident, you must be at least 10 years old but not older than 21, and live in rural community. You should also be capable of planning, managing, and operating the project with guidance and assistance from a project advisor.

This loans may be used to finance nearly any agriculturally based, income-producing project. Some common projects include: raising and breeding livestock, growing fruits or vegetables for resale, growing flowers or plants for resale, or producing field crops.

Equine Disease Outbreak in WI, Eastern Equine Encephalitis (EEE)

The mosquito-borne disease strikes the horse's central nervous system and has a mortality rate of 90 percent or higher. It has been detected in Price, Lincoln, Taylor, **Clark**, Marathon, and Dunn counties to date.

The state vet advises horse owners to call a veterinarian if their horses show any signs of central nervous system disease: depression, loss of appetite, drooping eyelids and lower lip, aimless wandering and circling, blindness and sometimes paralysis.

"EEE looks a lot like other diseases of the central nervous system – other strains of encephalitis, West Nile virus, equine herpes virus-1, even rabies," Ehlenfeldt said. "That's why it's important that you call a vet and get a definite diagnosis if possible. You need to know if other animals are at risk, or if there's a human health risk, because the same mosquitoes that infect horses may infect humans in some cases".

It may be too late for initial vaccines to be effective, because it takes several weeks for immunity to build up. But boosters are effective in a matter of days for horses that have already been vaccinated, so owners should consider that option. Owners should also eliminate any standing water that they can, and keep horses in the barn between dusk and dawn if possible, to limit their exposure to mosquitoes.

Clark County horses exhibited at the fair are required to be vaccinated for EEE and owners should consult their veterinarian for booster recommendations. Please remember this disease is transferred by mosquitos - there is no risk of transfer from horse saliva or airborne particles therefore it is essential to control the disease with vaccinations and vector control.
