The Cloverbud projects are where you and your family learn about 4-H. This book will help you to keep track of what you have done with your 4-H friends.

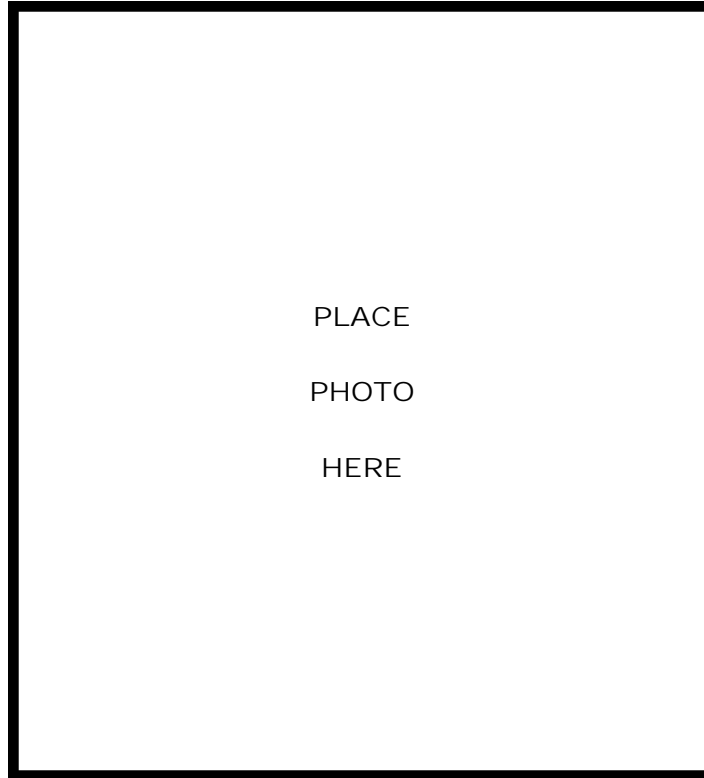

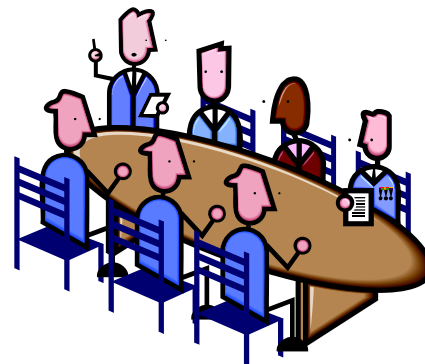

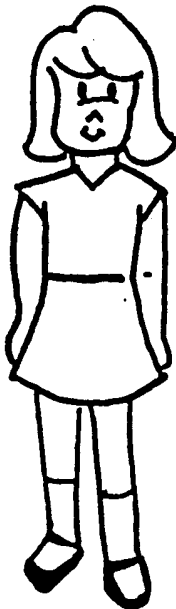

The 4-H emblem is a four leaf clover with the letter “H” on each leaf. The H’s stand for *Head, Heart, Hands, and Health*.

The 4-H colors are *Green and White*. Green symbolizes nature’s most common color. White symbolizes purity.
