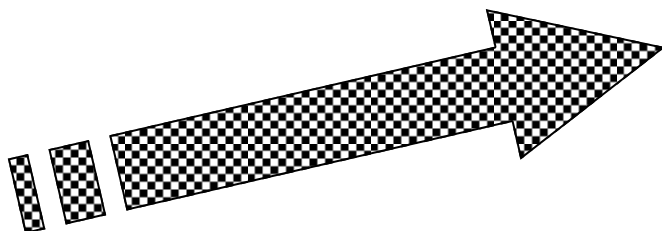

### **Rural Safety Day (May 4)**

- “Sandwich” cookies (approximately 350 youth participate in this event)

### **Clark County Department of Aging**

- Coffee/Tea
- Fruit in natural juices
- Meat products: tuna, salmon, canned meats (chicken, turkey, ham)
- Vegetables: carrots, beets, pork and beans (we usually have corn, peas, and green beans available)
- Low sodium or health choice soups (any variety)

- Graham crackers (good for diabetics)
- Soap: laundry, dish
- Personal care products: shampoo, bath soap (If you travel and don't know what to do with the small bottles of shampoo, lotion, and soaps, we will also give those out to the seniors)

### **Wisconsin/Nicaragua Sewing & Learning Project Materials**

- Fabric—one yard or more (no heavy wool or polyester—Nicaragua is a tropical country)
- Notions—pins, needles, buttons, thread, ribbon, Velcro, zippers, snaps, trims, laces, beads, etc.
- Crochet needles, knitting needles, hoops, yarn, embroidery floss, crochet and knitting patterns
- Quilting materials, quilting patterns and books

2011 Guidelines**

1. **Pre- registration is required. Deadline for entries is August 1, 2011.**
2. Each county chairman—if you want verification your entry was received, include email address or self-addressed stamped postcard.
3. Only one entry on each registration form. Send all forms together immediately after county show.
4. Any items **NOT** pre-registered will **NOT** be judged or displayed.
5. **NO** category changes will be made on entry day of show except by judge.
6. All work must be done by entrant and completed after the last year's county show. It must receive a first place at this year's county show or fair.
7. Each county can enter a total of 14 entries. This includes your poems, essays, and short stories.
8. Poems, essays and short stories/plays must accompany the registration forms. Must not be framed or in book form. All entries in categories 15, 16, and 17 must be typed. Use plain paper and 12 pitch font. Author must sign permission form if they agree to have their piece printed in HCE Update.
9. Kits and patterns may be used as long as entrant does all the work.
10. All items must be clean or laundered or will be disqualified by the judge.
11. Photography must be an 8"x10" matted or framed. Table easels are encouraged. **Please label them with your name and address.**
12. Cards—six—Must be mounted together on flat sturdy display board no larger than 24" x 30" or will be disqualified.
13. WAHCE is **NOT RESPONSIBLE** for any loss or damage of items on display.
