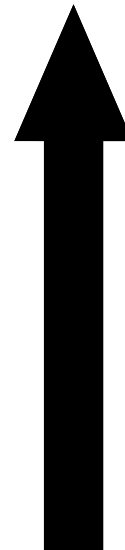

Rules:

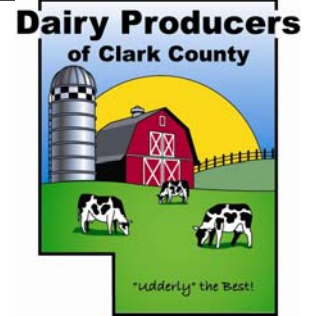
1. One entry per person.

3. Two or more generous dairy products must be used in the recipe. Dairy products must be circled in the recipe.
4. The recipe must be written out clearly indicating the two or more dairy products and the source of the recipe.
5. Eggs are not a dairy product.
6. Any recipe containing non-dairy products (i.e. whipped topping, margarine, etc.) will be disqualified. Recipes will be checked prior to judging.
7. All recipes (winning and non-winning) will become the property of the Clark County Dairy Promotion Committee.
8. The winner of the recipe contest will be the 2012 chairperson and will be allowed to select prizes, help find entertainment and choose the topic or topics for 2012; they can choose to do as little or as much as their time and availability allows.

Pre-registration is not required—just bring your dip (and crackers, fruits, vegetables, etc. that should be served with the dip) to the event that night.

If you're interested in tasting some samples after the contest, you should arrive at 7:30 p.m. (enter through the north doors).

Recipes from HCE Day—Enjoy!

PEA n CHEESE SALAD

Joanne B.

- 1 package (20 ounces) frozen peas (thawed)
 - 1 cup chopped celery
 - 2 hard boiled eggs, chopped
 - 1 cup cubed cheddar cheese
 - 1/2 cup thinly sliced radishes
 - 1/4 cup chopped green onions
 - 1 cup mayonnaise
 - 3 tablespoons sweet pickle relish
 - 1 teaspoon sugar
 - 1 teaspoon seasoned salt
 - 1 teaspoon ground mustard
1. In a large bowl combine the first 6 ingredients.
 2. In a small bowl combine the mayonnaise, relish, and seasonings. Stir into pea mixture.
 3. Cover and chill until serving
(8—10 servings)

SWEET POTATOES and PINEAPPLE

Sandy Fritz

- 3 cups cooked mashed sweet potatoes
 - 1/2 cup sugar
 - 1/2 cup milk
 - 1/4 cup butter, melted
 - 2 eggs, slightly beaten
 - 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
 - Dash of salt
- Topping:
- 1/4 cup sugar
 - 1/4 cup all purpose flour
 - 1 can (8 ounces) crushed pineapple, not drained
 - 1/4 cup butter, melted
 - 2 eggs
1. In a large bowl combine the first 7 ingredients. Pour into lightly greased 9" square baking dish.
 2. Combine topping ingredients; pour over potato mixture.
 3. Bake, uncovered, at 350° for 45—50 minutes or until a thermometer reads 160°
 4. Refrigerate leftovers.
(8—10 servings)

DUTCH APPLE DESSERT

- 1/2 cup margarine / butter
 - 1 1/2 cups graham cracker crumbs
1. Melt butter in pan in oven. Sprinkle crumbs on butter.
 2. Press into pan and then bake for 7 minutes at 350°.
- 14 ounces condensed milk
 - 8 ounces sour cream
 - 1/4 cup lemon juice
 - 1 can apple pie filling
 - 1/4 cup chopped walnuts
 - 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
1. Mix first 4 ingredients and spread over crust.
 2. Bake on lowest oven rack 25—30 minutes at 350°.
 3. Mix walnuts and cinnamon together; sprinkle over topping as soon as you take dish from oven.
 4. Refrigerate leftovers.

POTATO SALAD

Nancy Boortz, Candlelight

- 1 cup salad dressing
 - 3 tablespoons sugar
 - 2 tablespoons mustard
 - 1 tablespoon vinegar
 - 6 hard boiled eggs
 - 8 potatoes (boiled and cut into small pieces)
 - 2 stalks celery (chopped)
 - 1/2 onion (chopped)
1. In a small bowl mix first 4 ingredients.
 2. In a large bowl combine potatoes, eggs, onion, and celery.
 3. Pour dressing over potatoes and mix well.
 4. Let set for 1—2 hours before serving.
